MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT

GLOBAL ECONOMIC REVIEW

In the last few years, the world has faced waves of challenges, from the pandemic to the invasion of Ukraine, to the unfolding bank liquidity challenges amidst skittish depositors. The Corona-Delta variant for example poses a challenge to economic recovery by prolonging the pandemic, increasing the need for restrictions and changing consumer attitude.

How we get back to sustainable, long-term growth is the biggest question facing board rooms and political chambers around the world right now. Some of the biggest inflationary fears - widely predicted late last year - have been diluted by more direct, pro-active political action geared especially towards getting rising energy prices down. There are also signs that other commodities and food prices are finally starting to ease – aiding consumers and business owners who've been facing a significant financial squeeze.

The actions taken over the coming months are likely to play a significant role in the pace and nature of the world's economic retrieval. Employment levels should remain robust, even given recent tech layoff announcements— a sign that the rigidness of the labor market faced post-pandemic shows no sign of easing. It's an indication of the complexities the world faces today. Strong employment figures are often held up as an example of flexible market conditions, but they can also reflect the challenges Central Banks are facing as they attempt to juggle wage expectations, tightened credit conditions and the ever-present danger that any shift in the conflict in Ukraine could bring inflation back into the mix. The upside of a strong labor market, combined with relatively strong personal savings among consumers — especially in Europe and the Americas — means we could start to see a return to robust consumer spending, driving a return to slow-but-steady domestic growth in key markets.

INDUSTRY STRUCTURE AND DEVELOPMENTS

India's automotive industry is poised to become the world's third-largest market by 2030, showcasing its dominance in the international heavy vehicles arena. As the industry contributes significantly to India's GDP and manufacturing sector, the nation is also emerging as a leader in electric vehicle (EV) adoption.

India has cemented its place as the largest tractor manufacturer, the second-largest bus manufacturer, and the third-largest heavy truck manufacturer in the world. Currently, the automobile industry contributes 7.1% of India's GDP and accounts for 49% of its manufacturing GDP.

Electric Vehicle (EV) market is expected to grow at a CAGR of 49% between 2022-2030, with



annual sales reaching 10 million units by 2030. The booming EV industry is projected to create 50 million direct and indirect jobs by 2030. A market size of \$50 billion has been identified for EV financing in 2030, equivalent to 80% of the current size of India's retail vehicle finance industry, worth \$60 billion today.

Passenger vehicle sales reached their highest-ever level at 2,504,084 units in FY 2022-23 as of November 2022. The industry is expected to post a growth of 16% in FY23. India's trucking market is predicted to grow more than four-fold by 2050, with the number of trucks increasing from 4 million in 2022 to approximately 17 million by 2050.

A noticeable shift in customer preferences is evident as they gravitate towards larger and more powerful vehicles across all segments. In FY22, utility vehicles (UVs) among passenger vehicles (PVs) accounted for 49% of sales, up from 39% in FY21. Medium & heavy commercial vehicles (M&HCVs) among commercial vehicles (CVs) also increased, making up 33% of sales in FY22 compared to 28% in FY21.

India's \$222 billion automotive industry is anticipated to reach \$300 billion by 2026. Two-wheelers and passenger cars dominate the market, accounting for 76% and 17.4% of the market share, respectively. Small and mid-sized cars lead passenger car sales.

Exports of automobiles increased from 4,134,047 in 2020-21 to 5,617,246 in 2021-22, registering a positive growth of 35.9%. India aims to double its auto industry size to INR 15 lakh crore by the end of 2024. From April 2021 to March 2022, exports of passenger vehicles, commercial vehicles, three-wheelers, and two-wheelers all experienced positive growth compared to the same period last year.

The Indian government has demonstrated its commitment to the industry's growth by increasing the budget allocation of the Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Hybrid and Electric Vehicles (FAME) II by 78% in the Union Budget 2023. All in all, India's automotive industry is set for an upward trajectory, with strong growth potential in production, sales, and exports. As the nation transitions towards electric vehicles, the industry's economic impact will further expand, solidifying India's position as a global automotive powerhouse.

The ongoing shift in consumer preferences, increasing exports, and government support are key drivers in shaping the future of the industry. As the automotive market continues to evolve, India's strategic focus on innovation, infrastructure development, and sustainable practices will not only boost its economic growth but also position the country as a leading player in the international automotive arena by 2030 and beyond.

PERFORMANCE OF THE COMPMY

The Company operates in the auto components industry and is engaged in production and



manufacturing of Couplers, Connectors and allied products Blade Fuse and Wiper-Blades for OEMs and Tier 1 manufacturers. The total revenue from operations for the FY 2022-23 is Rs. 4,433.45 Lacs as against 2,945.87 Lacs in the previous year, which shows the considerable increase of 50.49%. Profit before tax of the Company has also grown by 53.82% to Rs. 302.21 Lacs as against 196.46 Lacs in the previous year.

With a vision of sustaining leadership position in manufacturing competitiveness, your Company is working eagerly to increase product portfolio and new applications. Moving to achieve the goal the company is comprehensively and proactively in process to fully utilize the platform developed for manufacturing of products under the segment of "Commercial Wipers" and "Mini Fuse".

Our work in the past few years in the area of auto wiper blades has given us the necessary base for potential growth in the existing customer base of wiper blades. The Company's policy of product innovation and the range of new products already introduced would yield sustainable profitability in the long run.

Started from a Sole Proprietorship Firm established in 1991, we have grown and reached to a to a listed Company in the name of Ultra Wiring Connectivity System Ltd. with an eye towards serving the automotive industry in various segments.

All we know that currently the Company owns 3 Manufacturing Plants, where - Unit 1 & Unit 2 are situated near Delhi in the HSIDC Industrial Area, Faridabad and Unit 3 in 'Industrial Model Town' Faridabad. The Company also owns warehouses in Pune to cater the Western markets in India.

We have been in the business of manufacturing of Couplers, Connectors and allied products for OEMs and Tier 1 manufacturers from more than 3 decades and as shared earlier with you all regarding the diversified fields of automotive section such as manufacturing of Blade Fuse and Wiper-Blades which will help us in enhancing our business manifolds.

Presently, the Manufacturing Plants are equipped with 35 Fully Automatic – PLC Controlled and All-Electric Injection Molding Machines that are imported from Japan and Taiwan, supported by a well-equipped in-house Tool-Room, where precision molds and dies are manufactured as per Japanese Standard JASO –D 616-2011 & ISO – 8092.

OUTLOOK

India's automotive industry is poised to become the world's third-largest market by 2030, showcasing its dominance in the international heavy vehicles arena. As the industry contributes significantly to India's GDP and manufacturing sector, the nation is also emerging as a leader in electric vehicle (EV) adoption.

The automotive industry in India is set to expand at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of



11.3% till 2027. This growth will most likely occur due to factors like rising disposable income, wide availability of credit and financing options, and growth of population. Furthermore, with the growth of the passenger transport sector and the rise in demand for commercial vehicles, the potential for future growth of India's automotive sector is pretty high.

Apart from this, industry-friendly policies and initiatives by the Indian Government will also play a major role in fueling this development in the years to come.

OPPORTUNITIES, THREATS AND RISK FACTORS

The automobile industry is a highly growing industry, continuously contributing to growth and development. Automobiles give people the opportunity to live, work and travel in ways that were unimaginable a few decades ago. The ease and quality of life improvements the automotive industry brings will only increase the demand for vehicles in the future.

With the advent of E-vehicles & alternative fuel such as Shell gas, CNG, and others, automobile companies are increasing R&D expenditure to drive the next phase of growth through the use of renewable sources of energy which may be solar, wind, etc.

To monitor cost and to manage shrinking margins, automobile companies like Harley, Volvo, Bharat Benz, etc. are building their manufacturing facilities in developing nations like India and China. These nations have a cheap workforce, are high in resources, and are nearer to developed economies. These are ideal conditions for an emerging market.

Whereas over the last 3-4 decades the automobile market has shifted from a demand to a supply market. Availability of a considerable number of variants, stiff competition between them, and a long list of alternatives to choose from has given power to customers to decide whatever they like.

Regulations like excise duty, no entry of outside vehicles in the state, decreasing number of the validity of registration period, and volatility in the fuel prices pose considerable challenges to automobile companies. These factors also affect the growth of the industry.

The employee turnover in the automobile industry is found to be higher when compared to several other sectors. Furthermore, attracting and retaining employees in the automotive industry can be very challenging, especially in the case where competitors are doing what they can to lure the best talent.

But optimization of fuel-driven combustion engines and cost efficiency programs are excellent opportunities for the automobile market. Emerging markets will be the primary growth drivers for a long time to come, and hence fuel-efficient cars are the need of the hour.



The increased availability of data and information, shift in consumer demand, and expanded regulatory requirements for safety and fuel economy will fuel the growth of this industry.

Entering new markets like Asian & BRIC nations will skyrocket the demand for vehicles. Furthermore, other markets are also likely to emerge soon.

The presence of a large number of players in the automobile industry results in intense competition and companies eating into other's share, leaving little scope for new players.

Macroeconomic uncertainty, recession, unemployment, etc. are the economic factors which will daunt the automobile industry for an extended period.

For the consumer segment, fluctuations in fuel prices remains the determining factor for growth. Also, government regulations pertaining to the use of alternative fuels like CNG and Shell gas is also affecting the inventories.

NOTE

1 CORPORATE INFORMATION

Ultra Wiring Connectivity System Limited is a public limited company domiciled in India and incorporated on 01st June 2005 under the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956 with its registered office being at Plot No. 287, 287 A &B, HSIIDC Industrial Estate, Sector 59, Faridabad. The company was originally registered as a private limited company. The company went on board in the month of September 2018 and is currently listed at the SME (Emerge) platform of National Stock Exchange of India. The company is engaged in the manufacturing & selling of wipers, connectors, cable tie clips and allied components. The company caters to domestic market mainly with few exports.

The company currently has three manufacturing facilities both of which are located in the Faridabad District of Haryana.

2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (AS-1)

These financial statements have been prepared to comply with Accounting Principles Generally accepted in India (Indian GAAP), the Accounting Standards referred to in Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with rule 7 of Company (Accounts) Rules, 2014 to the extent applicable.

The financial statements are prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention. Accounting Policies have been consistently applied by the company and are consistent with those used in the previous year. The financial statements are presented in Indian rupees.

2 USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires judgements, estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognised in the period in which the results are known/materialised.

3 REVENUE RECOGNITION (AS-9)

Sales are recognised, net of returns and trade discounts, on transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership to the buyer, which generally coincides with the delivery of goods to customers. Sales exclude Goods and Service Tax.

4 PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT (AS-10)

Tangible Fixed assets (Except Land) are stated at cost of acquisition less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. Cost comprises of the purchase price, net changes on foreign exchange contracts, adjustments arising from exchange rate variations attributable and attributable cost of bringing the asset to working condition for its intended use.



5 ACCOUNTING FOR GOVERNMENT GRANTS

Government grants are recognised when there is a reasonable assurance as to its receipt and that the conditions attached thereto shall be complied with. Government grants related to capital investments are reduced from the gross value of fixed assets and such grants relating to expenses are reduced from the related expense head.

6 DEPRECIATION

Depreciation on fixed assets is provided to the extent of depreciable amount on the Straightline Method (SLM) on the basis of useful life of the fixed assets. The company has adopted useful life of the Fixed Assets as prescribed in Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013.

7 INVENTORIES VALUATION (AS-2)

Cost of inventory comprise cost of purhcase and includes all charges in bringing the goods to the point of sale, including octroi and other levies, transit insurance and receiving charges.

Raw Material is valued at cost or Net Realizable Value whichever is less. The cost is determined mostly on FIFO basis.

WIP valued at cost of production, depending upon its level of completion.

Finished Goods valued at Cost of Production or Net Realizable Value whichever is less.

8 EMPLOYEE BENEFITS(AS-15)

Retirement benefits in the form of Provident Fund, which are defined contribution plans, are accounted for on accrual basis and charged to the Statement of Profit & Loss of the year.

The benefit in the form of Leave Encashment is a non accumulating short term compensated absences. It is accounted in the year when absences occur and charged to Statement of Profit & Loss of the year.

Retirement benefits in the form of Gratuity is accounted for in the accounts on the basis of estimate by the management and not on acturial valuation.

9 BORROWING COSTS (AS-16)

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition of qualifying assets are capitalised as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for intended use. All other borrowing costs are charged to revenue.

10 ACCOUNTING FOR TAXES ON INCOME (AS-22)

Company has followed accounting standard AS 22 for determination of tax expense in the accounts. Tax provision for current tax is made for income tax, based on the tax liability computed, after considering tax allowances and exemptions.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured using the tax rates and tax law that have been enacted or



substantively enacted by the Balance Sheet date.

11 PROVISIONS, CONTINGENT LIABILITIES AND CONTINGENT ASSETS (AS-29)

The company recognizes as Provision, the liabilities being present obligation arising out of past events, the settlement of which is expected to result in an outflow of resources and which can be measured only by using a substantial degree of estimation.

When there is a possible obligation or a present obligation in respect of which the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

Contingent assets are neither recognised nor disclosed.

13 CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

For the purpose of Cash Flow Statement, cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand and demand deposits with banks.

14 EARNINGS PER SHARE (AS-20)

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted EPS is computed using weighted average number of equity and dilutive equity equivalent shares outstanding during the year, except where results would be anti-dilutive.

15 FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS (AS-11)

- i. Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction.
- ii. Monetary items denominated in foreign currency at the end of year are reported using the closing rate.
- iii. Non monetary foreign currency items are carried at cost using the exchange rate at the date of transaction.
- iv. Any Gain or Loss on account of exchange difference either on settlement or on translation is recognized in the Statement of Profit & Loss except in case they relate to acquisition of fixed assets, they are adjusted to the carrying cost of such assets.

16 SEGMENT (AS-17)

The company operates in a single segment, no segment reporting is required by the company as of now.


